

WEEELABEX Certification scheme - Operators EURo B2501

Increase of minimum score for Priority 2 questions: The minimum score to pass the WEEELABEX audit for Priority 2 questions was increased from 75% to 80%. See <u>B04 Guidance</u> <u>Document</u> Section 4.8.5.4

The CLC/TS 50625-5 Specification for the final treatment of WEEE fractions - Copper and precious metals (Type 4) was implemented. See <u>B04 TR Eligibility of TR and Re-use Operators</u>.

Mixed equipment (generally WEEE Categories 5, 6) may contain large appliances Category 4 associated with collection and/or treatment of small equipment; may contain radiators containing oil belonging to Category 1; may contain laptops/notebooks belonging to Category 2; may contain LED lamps belonging to Category 3). See WEEELABEX Statement 2023_001 and WEEELABEX Statement 2025_001.

The term "TEE" is used instead of previous term "CFA" ("Cooling and freezing appliances")

An Operator must apply for certification and be audited for all WEEE types that are treated onsite and belong to the audited WEEE stream.

See <u>WEEELABEX Statement 2025 002</u>.Transition period from 1st August 2025 to 31st December 2026.

An **Administration fee** shall be paid by the Operator **for any major administrative change** made after the acknowledgement of the Conformity Verification. *See WEEELABEX Price List.*

Before 30th June 2026 - the operator **can select** to be audited according to the EURo B2501 or against the previous version EURo B2101.

After 30th June 2026 - the operator will be audited against the updated WEEELABEX documents and tools (Certification scheme Operators EURo B2501). See <u>CO7</u>
